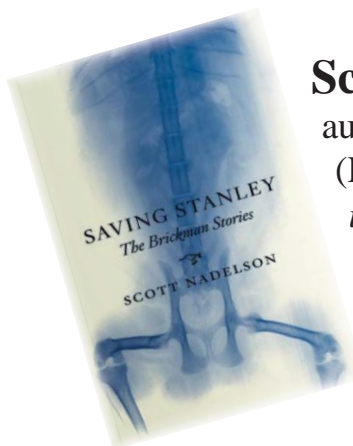

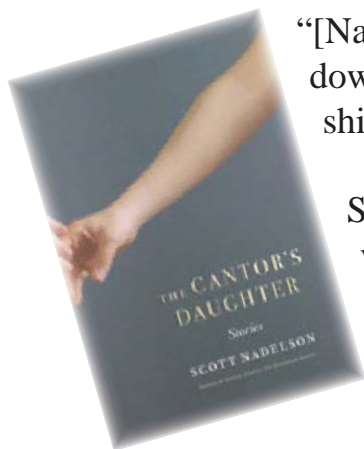

**Scott Nadelson**, a recipient of an Oregon Literary Fellowship, is the author of two short story collections: *Saving Stanley: The Brickman Stories* (Hawthorne 2004) and *The Cantor's Daughter* (Hawthorne 2006). *Saving Stanley* won an Oregon Book Award and the Great Lakes Colleges Association New Writers Award. His stories and essays have appeared in *South Dakota Review*, *Oregon Literary Review*, *Arts & Letters*, *Del Sol*, and *American Literary Review*, among others.

Reviewers have praised his “beautifully crafted stories” and said that “[Nadelson] is adept at peeling away the superfluous layers and getting down to the unpleasant intricacies that are a part of our everyday relationships, be they parental, familial, marital, fraternal, or casual.”



Scott received his M.A. in Creative Writing from Oregon State University and has taught at Marylhurst University, Lewis & Clark College, and the Art Institute of Portland, among others. He is currently a Visiting Assistant Professor at Willamette University.
