MEETING OF ADVISORY COUNCILDecember 6, 1928

The Advisory Council met at the call of the President at 3:45, December 6, 1928.

All members were present.

The minutes for several preceding meetings were approved without reading.

It was determined by lot that Dean Carpenter and Professor Boyer should hold over as members of the Advisory Council and that Dean Sheldon, Dean Gilbert, Professor Barnett and Professor Packard should retire.

President Hall reported briefly on the status of the "Floating University." He announced that a plan which met his general approval had already been developed, and that a number of Western institutions have been invited to join in this project. The University of Oregon has been invited to have complete charge for the first three years, after which time, the institution having charge will be determined by the academic organization. The financial end of the project will be cared for by a separate corporation which will guarantee that the University of Oregon shall, in no way, become financially involved.

Since the Faculty meeting had been called for 4:00, the short time permitted only brief discussion by various members of the Council.
